## COP27 & COP15 ACTION

**World leaders are gathering in Egypt now for the United Nations Conference of the Parties, COP 27, on climate change and in Canada in December for the Conference of the Parties, COP 15, on biodiversity.**

These two meetings present another opportunity for world leaders to agree on actions which will address the twin crises of climate change and loss of biodiversity.

They also present us with an opportunity as people of faith to join with others in calling for effective action to deal with these immense ecological crises.



### **POPE FRANCIS CALLS FOR ACTION ON COP 27 & COP 15**

In his Message for the 2022 World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation, Pope Francis urged world leaders to commit to ambitious plans at the COP 27 to achieve the goal of keeping global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius.

He also urged leaders gathering at the COP 15 to make new multilateral agreements to halt the alarming increases in destruction of ecosystems and extinction of species.

The Holy Father reminds us that the Gospel calls us to repentance, to a new relationship with God and a different relationship with others and with all of creation. This conversion of heart will lead us to take action personally, but also communally to care for our common home.

Help us to love this wondrous earth and all who live on it as You love it.

Give us the resolve to work together to make the difference that is so urgently needed.

We put our trust in You and ask all this through Jesus Christ who draws all of creation to the fullness of life which is only found in You. Amen.
